Title	Assess Elderlies' Emotions and Suicidal ideation

Range	This Unit of Competency is applicable to employees in the elderly care service industry who provide care services to elderlies. This Competency involves non-routine tasks that require sophisticated thinking and the ability to make judgment. Employees are required to assess the emotional conditions of elderlies according to relevant guidelines of the institution, and identify those with suicidal ideation, in order to prevent suicide.

Competency	<ul> <li>Performance Requirements <ol> <li>Relevant knowledge on elderlies' emotions and triggers of suicidal ideation</li> <li>Be able to</li> <li>Understand relevant assessment mechanism and guideline of the institution regarding the prevention of suicide among elderlies</li> <li>Understand the professional attitude and code of conduct required when assessing elderlies, such as <ul> <li>Treat each elderly as an independent individual; respect and accept their points of view, avoid blaming and criticizing</li> <li>Act impartially</li> <li>Acctrain the value of elderlies' life</li> <li>Understand the skills to assess the factors that affect elderlies' emotions</li> <li>Understand the skills to identify elderlies with suicidal ideation</li> <li>Understand the skills to build trust with elderlies and their families</li> </ul> </li> <li>Assess elderlies' emotions and their suicidal ideation <ul> <li>Be able to</li> <li>Assess elderlies following the assessment mechanism stipulated in relevant guideline of the institution, such as:</li> <li>Choose relevant assessment tools, such as Geriatrics Depression Scale, Suicidal Risk Assessment Form etc.</li> <li>Review counselling records, especially for those with personal or family history of suicide</li> <li>Review medical records, especially for those with chronic diseases, depression or other mental disorders</li> <li>Refer the cases to relevant community services for assessment Service, etc.</li> <li>Interview with elderlies to obtain relevant information, for example, the planned suicide methods, planned date of suicidal act, time, location, reasons for not ye committing suicide, etc.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Identify elderlies with suicidal ideation and pay attention to the signs of suicide, includin <ul> <li>Physical aspects: physical fatigue, significant change in appetite, and weight loss or gain</li> <li>Emotional aspects: loss of interest in daily activities or hobbies, feeling helpless or hopeless</li> <li>Cognitive aspects: forgetfulness, difficulty concentrating</li></ul></li></ol></li></ul>

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	<ul> <li>Behavioural aspects: psychomotor agitation and/ or retardation, no longer caring about physical appearance, giving away their favourite items</li> <li>Establish trust and effective communications with elderlies and their families, to assess elderlies' conditions and act promptly</li> <li>Document the assessment results and follow-up plan in elderlies' personal record</li> </ul>
