

MAKING DEGREES COMPARABLE IN ASEAN AND BEYOND


SHARE WORKS ON THE FOLLOWING ASPECTS:

SHARE supports the development of a politically endorsed regional qualifications framework.

SHARE contributes to better comparability of degrees in ASEAN and the EU, by taking into account existing initiatives in Europe (European Qualifications Framework for Lifelong Learning EQF & Qualifications Framework for the European Higher Education Area QF-EHEA) and in ASEAN (ASEAN Qualifications Reference Framework, AQRF).

National Qualifications Frameworks (NQFs) have been established in Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, Thailand, Vietnam and Singapore (sectoral qualifications framework). SHARE can assist these countries in referencing to the AQRF.

SHARE assists ASEAN Member States, in which NQFs are still in development or under discussion, to develop their NQFs cognisant of the AQRF: Lao PDR and Myanmar.
