

- Developing effective and productive link between HE and national economic development, and with national culture and identity (competent workforce)
- Provides regulatory and incremental transformation and training (promoting self regulation, accountability, industry led quality standards and harmonised across public and private institutions
- Managing borderless education, regional integration and trade agreement
- Improving the quality of post secondary/higher education provision.





Exercise of benchmarking - Objective: to enable MQA and NZQA to "accept" and "recognise" each other's decision on programme accreditation

Outcome : A Statement of Confidence (of quality)

Premise of recognition by others –quality of programmes and qualifications



Approach

Agreed to scope and approach to exercise by adopting the European referencing methods-criteria and process

- Determining the existence of an acceptable compatible system (Higher education, Laws and policies)
- Quality Assurance systems
- Comparability of qualifications framework –"Bachelor" (NZQA Level 7 and MQF Level 6-level descriptors), credits and non-credit bearing criteria
- Appointment of independent international verifier
- Use of end product
- 18 months



Challenges

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- Differences in national education and training systems
- Different stage of HE development
- Seeking common comparable and acceptable systems and values
- Difference in interpretation of national qualifications framework- credits, learning outcomes, cultural sensitivities, separate frameworks, language
- Transparency and appropriate information systems
- Strengthening / sustaining confidence with continual regular joint activities and exchanges
