Implementation Plan

- The EDB announced the implementation of the ATS and Use of Credit in **October 2012**. Educational institutions and training providers will adopt the award titles according to the ATS and show the QF credit of their programmes on the QR by phases.
- Effective from **1 January 2014**, all <u>programmes newly registered in the QR</u> will adopt titles that conform to the ATS. Effective from **1 January 2016**, all <u>programmes on the QR</u> will adopt titles that conform to the ATS.
- In respect of the programmes at **Levels 1 to 4**, the QF credit will also be shown on the QR according to the above timetable.

Award Titles Scheme and Use of Credit under Qualifications Framework

The Education Bureau (EDB) of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Government has launched the Qualifications Framework (QF) to provide a platform to promote continuing education and lifelong learning with a view to enhancing the competitiveness of our workforce. The QF is a seven-level hierarchy of qualifications. All qualifications recognised under the QF have to go through a robust quality assurance process before they are uploaded onto the Qualifications Register (QR) (www.hkqr.gov.hk).

To facilitate learners in choosing suitable learning programmes, the EDB announced in October 2012 the implementation of the **Award Titles Scheme** and **Use of Credit** under the QF. The two initiatives aim to enhance the transparency of qualifications and enable learners to know clearly the level of a qualification and the learning time required to complete a programme.



Award Titles Scheme

The Award Titles Scheme (ATS) specifies the award titles that can be used for qualifications at various QF levels so that learners can better understand the level of qualifications from the titles.



• There are a few special award titles that are permitted by the EDB and recognised under the QF.

Each programme recognised under the QF is assigned a QR Registration Number, with the last digit signifying its QF level (1 for Level 1 and 2 for Level 2, etc.)

The credit unit adopted under the QF in Hong Kong, known as "QF Credit", indicates the overall learning time expected to complete a programme. One QF credit consists of 10 notional learning hours, which takes into account the total time likely to be spent by an average learner on all modes of learning, including attendance in classes, self-study, on-line learning, practical learning, examination, etc. Providers will show the QF credit of their programmes on the QR by phases to enable learners to know the volume of learning of a programme and the expected time required to complete the learning.
