<mark>Step 1</mark> : Programme Design

State the overall intended learning outcomes

Learning Programme

Estimate the QF level and credit size of the programme

Generic Level Descriptors

7 levels with different features No relevant SCSs Specifications of Competency Standards (SCS) of the 23 industries implementing HKQF



SCSs can occupy over 60% of the learning content



QF-Recognized programmes in general



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Determine the QF level and credit size of the programme

(for Diploma, there is credit requirement of minimum 60 QF-credits)



With QF level & credit size



SCS-based programmes



Select the list of Units of Competency

Majority of the learning content should be drawn from the SCSs (i.e. 60% of total QF credits or 72 QF credits, whichever is the lower)



Estimate the total credit size

- 1 credit = 10 notional learning hours
- Check the Qualifications Guidelines on QF website for details

Step 2: Accreditation of programme

■ To be conducted by The Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications (HKCAAVQ)

The operator has to go through:

Initial Evaluation (IE)

- Institutional competency to achieve its stated purposes
- Adequate resources to develop, deliver, assess & quality assure its learning programmes



Learning Programme Accreditation (LPA)

- An overall evaluation of the learning programme (incl. planning, syllabuses, delivery arrangements, assessment methods, intended learning outcomes)
- Ensure the learning programme is appropriate for the qualification as claimed

Step 3: Listing on the HKQR

- i. Upload the programme onto the Hong Kong Qualifications Register (HKQR) (www.hkqr.gov.hk)
- ii. Check for funding and grants available for QF-recognized courses:

Development Grant for SCS-based/ SGC-based programmes (must be programmes newly developed and launched)

- Subsidy of \$30,000 for SCS-based programmes with 12 to 35 QF credits, \$50,000 for programmes with 36 or more QF credits.
- Subsidy of \$20,000 for SGC-based programmes with 6 to 17 QF credits, \$40,000 for programmes with 18 or more QF credits.
- Under reimbursable courses of Continuing Education Fund (CEF)
